

Brislington Community Partnership guidelines

Eligibility

In order for BCP to consider your application you must meet our funding criteria.

- Your project must meet one or more priorities of the partnership action plan.
- Your project must take place in Brislington.
- If you work with young people please enclose a copy of your child protection policy.
- You must be a group with a set of rules or constitution, we do not fund individuals.
- You must be a small organisation with a turnover of under £80k.
- Your organisation / group purpose must contribute to the benefit of the local community.
- You must complete the application form.
- You must be prepared to demonstrate to BCP the success or development of your project.
- Required to respond to application queries within 14 days.

Below are the **Ten Priorities for Brislington Community Partnership**, for more details of the priorities please request a copy of the partnership action plan or download it on line go to www.brislington.org/ and view the community action plan CAP.

1.Environment For Brislington to make positive use of derelict and unmanaged spaces for sustainably lit cycle ways and walkways, for community gardens, for play spaces, for education.

2.Employment For Brislington to have greater long term and short term employment opportunities working with employers and education to have greater training and apprenticeship opportunities.

3.Older people For older people to have access to the services that they want and for more intergenerational communication and opportunities for dialogue.

4.Younger People To work with young people and service providers to encourage active youth participation in identifying problems and developing creative solutions.

5.Planning To work with stakeholders to encourage innovative development to ensure affordable housing and effective services that are sensitive to residents' needs. Brislington Village could be a focus for regeneration, making it a place with a rich and diverse street scene that people feel they can safely use

6.Health To work with stakeholders across departments to encourage healthy lifestyles and tackle more chronic social health issues.

7.Education To continue to work with Extended Schools Partnership and other partners to ensure that residents participate in local opportunities for lifelong learning.

8.Leisure That Brislington's leisure activities and opportunities are accessible for all.

9.Crime and safety To foster a perception of Brislington based in fact, which emphasises the relative safety of the Wards and works with service providers to focus on vulnerable areas and communities.

10.Traffic and transport To work with service providers to transform Brislington from a commuter 'rat run' into a transport flagship community.
