## **2 Minutes and matters arising**

Minutes of the last meeting: AOB, point 7. Carols were at Arnos Park

Matters arising: Louise Bale raised the issue that the Vice Chair vacancy (from the January AGM) needed to be addressed at this meeting. David Waters added this as an agenda item. Ali Hender nominated and seconded and stood uncontested. AH duly elected Vice Chair.

## **3 Callington Road Cycle Link**

John Richfield (BCC, Cycling City) spoke about cycle link from Brislington to Callington Road – the Sainsburys to Tesco link. Callington Road car route has been postponed and BCC wishes to add a cycle and footpath to make travel easier and safer. JR took the meeting through the proposed route and confirmed that BCC hoping to acquire Brethren-owned land to complete the link, with a possible compulsory purchase order. Also in negotiations with Mr Stephens, of the Talbot Road scrap yard. The route has been submitted for planning consent. Cycling City due to finish March 2011. DW raised concerns about potential conflicts between cyclists and pedestrians. JR confirmed that other cycle routes have been successful in this regard.

## **4 PACT**

3 priorities from previous meeting were 1) ASB around Sandringham Pub, 2) ASB on Hollywood Road and Church Hill, 3) Vehicles causing obstruction on Brislington Hill

- 1) Officers have spoken with landlord. A Licensing Enforcement visit is still pending.

- 2) Officers have visited residents. No further ASB calls regarding behaviour. One call regarding quad bikes relates to use of private land.
- 3) Officers gave update last month. Problems negotiated and resolved. Agreement to restrict vehicle parking to 1 outside premises.

New issues voted:

- 1) Criminal and anti-social behaviour at Eastwood Road flats;
- 2) Social services and child safety issues with regard to use of quad bikes in lanes behind Alison Avenue. Police to work with Social Services partners;
- 3) Pavement parking at Birchwood Road, School Road, Alderney Ave.
